## What is the MyCoventry Project?

Launched in January 2021, the MyCoventry project is a two-year, multi-partner initiative that is designed to deliver a host of innovative and exciting programmes that tackle and eradicate barriers to full integration for newly arrived members of the community.

Spearheaded by Coventry City Council and consisting of five partner organisations - Coventry University, ACH, St Francis Employability, The Job Shop and Positive Youth Foundation - the two-year initiative is partly funded through a £1.5million grant from the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund (AMIF).

Barriers impeding full integration for newly arrived members of the community are often cited as being language skills, employability skills and knowledge as well as community/social links.

## **Our Aims & Objectives**

We hope that by focusing on these areas we will not only create, but foster a culture of inclusion, friendliness and prosperity, where newly arrived members of the community feel they have a true sense of belonging in their new home.

By bringing together five specialist organisations - all of whom provide expert knowledge and leadership within project delivery - we will utilise a holistic approach in order to bridge service gaps, provide mentoring and coaching, and support not only client integration but progression too.
